



<i>Anzac soldiers</i>	<i>Elite Maori</i>
<b>Were Constructive:</b> Went to war to serve their country and to preserve democracy and the freedom of everyone.	<b>Are Destructive:</b> Elite Maori have gone to war with the rest of New Zealand and on their journey are destroying democracy and the freedom and rights of the majority.
<b>Were Selfless:</b> Left their families to go and fight - leaving their children, wives, husbands, grandparents, neighbours, friends.	<b>Are Selfish:</b> Are feathering the nests of themselves and their families, while the rest of their tribe are left to struggle, not seeing any of the spoils of war. Nepotism.
<b>Created racial unity:</b> Maori and Pakeha fought side by side and became life long friends. They modeled for all to see how fighting for the same cause created unbelievable racial unity and bonding.	<b>Are creating racial division:</b> Increasing numbers of non Maori New Zealanders are not seeing Maori as their friends. That is to say, elite Maori are giving decent hardworking Maori a bad name. Racial division is widening. Many business people are feeling they are being forced to co-operate with elite Maori 'extortion behaviours' otherwise they will lose business. This is leading to increasingly deep resentment.
<b>Engendered pride:</b> Anzac soldiers made people feel proud of being a Kiwi.	<b>Are engendering shame:</b> Elite Maori are bringing shame on their race.
<b>Inspired their fellow countrymen and women:</b> Their going and sacrifice inspired others around them, not just other Anzac soldiers, but people at home.	<b>Are alienating</b> all other non-elite Maori New Zealanders by going after the cash and assets belonging to all New Zealanders.
<b>Created unity:</b> All Kiwis were inspired by our Anzac soldiers and service people because they admired their commitment to their country. The result? We were one.	<b>Are Creating separatism.</b> The new look New Zealand is made up of two groups - elite Maori and the rest. According to them, we are now not one. We are two.
<b>Were not money hungry.</b> Pride in their country came first, then fighting to preserve democracy and freedom came next. Seeking money was a distant last. In fact, most had no care for money whatsoever.	<b>Are money hungry.</b> Money for the elite tribal family first, and all other people are last. In fact, all other people don't feature at all in the thinking of elite Maori.

<p><b>Were not racist.</b> They didn't want special favours because they were Anzacs. Rather, they denounced special favours. Such things were abhorrent to them.</p>	<p><b>Are racist.</b> They repeatedly demand special favours and privilege, not given to anyone else. This is apartheid.</p>
<p><b>Were honest and transparent.</b> They went to war for their country and to fight for the freedom of all people. As such they were transparent, marked by integrity</p>	<p><b>Are dishonest and deceitful.</b> They are constantly trying to trick and deceive the rest of the population i.e. the 3 Waters Legislation, ultimately for their own gain.</p>
<p><b>Were humble.</b> They did not consider themselves greater or above everyone else. Quite the contrary. They considered themselves to be the least and as such were ready to give up their lives by going to war.</p>	<p><b>Are proud.</b> Elite Maori portray themselves as superior, a cut above everyone else, especially the average Maori on the street.</p>
<p><b>Secured the future for others.</b> By going to war, they secured the prosperity and security of others. Their children and grandchildren would not have to face a foreign invasion by a hostile country.</p>	<p><b>Are destroying hope in the future.</b> Maori elite want to eventually install tribal rule. As such they are giving New Zealanders who have had their eyes opened to the elite Maori agenda a bleak / hopeless view of the future.</p>
<p><b>Were service orientated.</b> Their heart was to serve others, whether it be the people back home, or their fellow Anzac soldiers. Really, they become the least, so that they could serve and help the rest.</p>	<p><b>Are 'we demand to be served' orientated.</b> It's obvious Elite Maori want cash and assets so that they can clip the ticket on the way through. Thus they want to have everyone else working for them. They see others as their slaves. This is the precursor to Maori dictatorship.</p>
<p><b>Were giving.</b> Their lives were about giving, not taking. In fact, taking did not enter their heads.</p>	<p><b>Are takers.</b> Giving does not enter the heads of the elite Maori. Rather, it's all about taking and getting.</p>
<p><b>Provoke positive memories.</b> Memorials and photos of our Anzacs are everywhere to be seen, and rightly so. We want to remember them, because they are worth remembering. Why? Because the attitudes and behaviours they displayed lifted the human condition, and keep on lifting the human condition.</p>	<p><b>Are Provoking negative memories.</b> In 100 years from now, there will be no public displays of elite Maori, no busks, except those which have been erected by themselves or their benefactors. Why is this? Because their attitudes and behaviours have angered and depressed the rest of the population. No one feels good about the people who have shafted them.</p>
<p><b>Created inspiring stories.</b> Are Anzacs were worth remembering. Stories of sacrifice and heroism abound. We love those stories because they inspire us, no matter what our vocation today. They take us to the next level in our thinking and attitudes.</p>	<p><b>Are constantly Creating fake stories.</b> Elite Maori often simply make up stories as the basis for their claims for reparation. The Waitangi Tribunal allows this. Fraud and corruption are their hallmarks. As such, when co-governance is stopped, ended, the bad memories of what elite Maori were up to will linger for all the wrong reasons, pretty much like our memories of what the Nazis did in Germany in the 1930's and 40's.</p>

<p><b><i>Were an inspiration to others.</i></b> Observers watching our Anzac soldiers were inspired by their commitment, selflessness, sacrifice and dedication. As such, observers at home ‘upped their game’ as a result of observing the attitude and actions of our Anzacs.</p>	<p><b><i>Are repelling.</i></b> Elite Maori don’t inspire others. They deflate others. They discourage others. Non elite Maori observe elite Maori greed, dishonesty and selfishness and are repelled by their example.</p>
<p><b><i>Inspired the media of their day.</i></b> Anzacs provided the media of their day with a rich source of inspiring stories and accounts from the battle field. These stories live on and continue to inspire.</p>	<p><b><i>Are Corrupting the Media of Their day.</i></b> Empowered and funded by the government and the \$55m Public Interest Journalism Fund, elite Maori have totally corrupted the media such that it now only pumps out dishonest and unbalanced stories.</p>
<p><b><i>Inspired children in Schools.</i></b> Children of all ages in all our schools were lifted in their spirits and minds by the accounts of the heroics and sacrifice of our Anzac soldiers.</p>	<p><b><i>Are Brainwashing and grooming the children in our schools.</i></b> Elite Maori, empowered and enabled by the government, have infiltrated schools for the purpose of grooming our children, getting them ready for tribal rule.</p>
<p><b><i>Modelled inspiring behaviour and attitudes.</i></b> Observing / reading about our Anzacs is inspirational.</p>	<p><b><i>Are radicalising young impressionable Maori.</i></b> Many young impressionable Maori are being radicalised by observing elite Maori. Young Maori are learning to demonise non Maori, especially white European non Maori. Young Maori are taught that Europeans are evil, white, colonialists, directly responsible for poor Maori outcomes in society.</p>
<p><b><i>The message Anzacs sent to all New Zealanders?</i></b> “We love our country so much we are prepared to die to preserve our democracy and freedom.”</p>	<p><b><i>The message Elite Maori are sending to all non-elite Maori New Zealanders?</i></b> “We are the only people who matter. As for the rest? We couldn’t care a SH_ T about you. All we need you for is to provide us with on-going cash flow. You are about to become our slaves, and there is nothing you can do about it. Thanks for setting up New Zealand for us, all the infrastructure, all the businesses, all the hospitals and schools, the army, the police...everything. You did it all. Who for? You did it for us. For this moment in history. And soon it’s going to be all ours! You suckers! This is a pre-1840 tribal raid, just like our tribes used to do to each other before you Pakaha came to these Islands, and we are doing it again, but this time we are coming for you. And you know what? You guys are a push over. You are easy beats. We have not had to fire one bullet, and we’ve just about done it. Pakeha put up no fight. They cave in quickly to a bit of bullying and intimidation. They believe any story we make up and tell them. They give us money for anything and everything. Sheesh. This has been as easy as taking candy off kids.”</p>
