

Instructions for BDL's (Book Delivery Leaders) in Each City About how to organize delivery to a city

Step one: Watch this short movie: <https://youtu.be/tkt6OV3FRaw>

Step two: Print all your pages with the list of suburbs and streets in your town or city

This is how I organised Tauranga. Click [HERE](#) to view

Step three: Then, phone or email Tim in Wellington. Ask him what streets have already been delivered to. Cross these streets off your master list. teacher.tim@icloud.com or 021 027 57652

Step four: Then, when someone phones you (you are the Book Delivery Leader or BDL) who wants to help, ask them to deliver books in their suburb. Say “Thanks for offering to help. What suburb do you live in?”

Step five: When they tell you, you email a list of the streets in that suburb which have yet to be delivered. Ask them to choose some streets to deliver.

Step six: Then ask them to pick up their books from the local PUP which stands for Pick Up Point.

We are asking each town / city / suburb to find someone in the middle of the city or town or suburb who would act as a place where people can come and pick up books. This means they have to store a few boxes of book. Having a PUP in a town or city means everyone saves money on postage.

Then ask them to phone you when they have completed the streets they said they would deliver to.

Repeat this procedure for every town / city / suburb.

Summary:

The goal: To have one of Julian Batchelor's booklets delivered to every house in your town / city / suburb

To achieve this goal you will need:

1. A supply of Julian Batchelor's books
2. People in your city / town / suburb who will help deliver books.
3. “You've Invited” invitations to attach to the front of Julian's books (right)
4. A PUP – a pick up point in your town / city / suburb
5. A BDL or a Book Delivery Leader
6. A lap top
7. A printer



A team of us in Tauranga spent the day gluing and stapling “You're Invited” invitations on the front of Julian's books Then they dropped these down to the PUP (The Banana Blossom Café) so that when people phone to want to help with deliveries, they can phone or email Rhonda and get going, and get their books from the PUP.

We are trying to make things as cheap and easy as possible for people to get the books out.
